

PLAN A: Have a full fair

1. Fair will run from Wednesday through Sunday (July 15-19).
2. All grandstand events, the Horse Show, Livestock Show and Auction, Rancher's Day activities will be held using social distancing, extra sanitization and limiting numbers. Flagging will be placed throughout all bleacher and grandstand areas for social distancing. (The Miss Lassen County Pageant will be held on Tuesday evening.)
3. Hand washing stations will be distributed throughout the fairgrounds (barns, show areas and midway). Number of stations will depend on availability through sanitation agencies.
4. Where possible, ground will be taped or marked for social distancing.
5. Buildings and barns will be monitored by staff and/or volunteers to limit number of visitors.
6. As determined by current health regulations, visitor numbers will be limited at gate (example: 100 visitors per gate every 2 hours).
7. Social distancing, Tobacco Awareness, hand washing and "No Dogs on Fairgrounds" signs will be hung throughout fairgrounds.
8. Loud speaker will broadcast reminders for hand washing a social distancing throughout the fairgrounds every half hour.
9. Livestock will arrive as scheduled with social distancing measures being taken during tagging, weigh-in and pen placement. All animals (including rabbits and poultry) will be spaced throughout the barn areas in a manner that allows for social distancing).
10. Livestock show will run in the normal manner with the exception of smaller classes to accommodate social distancing within the show ring (6 feet between animals in ring as well as the line waiting to enter the ring). During judging, the judge and exhibitors will utilize social distancing and hand sanitization.
11. The Livestock Auction will be held on Sunday as in the past. The layout will utilize a larger area, perhaps the entire Pavilion, to accommodate social distancing. The 4-H breakfast and dessert area will be housed on the lawn to help facilitate social distancing. The 4-H volunteers will develop a social distancing plan for their part of the event as will the Junior Livestock Committee.
12. Develop a plan to live-stream auction for those who may be unable to attend because of Covid.
13. Bleachers at **all** events will be sanitized regularly (once or twice daily depending on the amount of use).
14. All and camp trailers will be moved in on Saturday, July 11th, as normal. A letter outlining the importance of social distancing in this area will be sent out ahead of the camper's arrival. Social distancing signage will be placed throughout this area and loud speaker reminders will be broadcast throughout the day.

15. The Lassen County Fair will attempt to procure extra picnic tables from Plumas County Fair to be used to promote social distancing throughout the fairgrounds (including the camping area). We are hoping to do a trade allowing Plumas to use our tables during their fair.
16. Fair Manager will meet with Rancher's Day, Horse Show and Beer Garden representatives and request a plan to be submitted to fair office by July 1st that outlines measures they will be taking to ensure social distancing, hand washing and sanitation during their events.
17. Fair Manager or a Fair Advisory Board Member will meet with gate staff, ticket takers, barn and building monitors to outline plan for social distancing.
18. Policy for Animal Rights groups will be made available and area will be designated in the event that Animal Rights groups come to fair.
19. Contact Carnival Manager, vendors and entertainers to determine previous locations and testing measures. Health Department to help with testing throughout fair if necessary.
20. Provide masks, hand-sanitizer, sanitizing wipes to all Staff, Advisory Board Members and Volunteers.
21. Vendor Camping area will be held to same standard as Livestock camping.

PLAN B: Have a 3-day fair with regular livestock show and auction

1. Fair will be run from Friday through Sunday (July 17-19).
2. The Friday, Saturday and Sunday night grandstand events, Horse Show, Livestock Show and Auction, Rancher's Day activities will be held using social distancing, extra sanitization and limiting numbers. Flagging will be placed throughout all bleacher and grandstand areas for social distancing. (The Miss Lassen County Pageant will be held on Tuesday evening.)
3. Hand washing stations will be distributed throughout the fairgrounds (barns, show areas and midway). Number of stations will depend on availability through sanitation agencies.
4. Where possible, ground will be taped or marked for social distancing.
5. Buildings and barns will be monitored by staff and/or volunteers to limit number of visitors.
6. As determined by current health regulations, visitor numbers will be limited at gate (example: 100 visitors per gate every 2 hours).
7. Social distancing, Tobacco Awareness, hand washing and "No Dogs on Fairgrounds" signs will be hung throughout fairgrounds.
8. Loud speaker will broadcast reminders for hand washing a social distancing throughout the fairgrounds every half hour.

PLAN C: Have a 3-day fair with Jack-pot type livestock show and regular livestock auction

1. Fair will be run from Friday through Sunday (July 17-19).
2. The Friday, Saturday and Sunday night grandstand events, Horse show, Livestock Show and Auction, Rancher's Day activities will be held using social distancing, extra sanitization and limiting numbers. Flagging will be placed throughout all bleacher and grandstand areas for social distancing. (The Miss Lassen County Pageant will be held on Tuesday evening.)
3. Hand washing stations will be distributed throughout the fairgrounds (barns, show areas and midway). Number of stations will depend on availability through sanitation agencies.
4. Where possible, ground will be taped or marked for social distancing.
5. Buildings and barns will be monitored by staff and/or volunteers to limit number of visitors.
6. As determined by current health regulations, visitor numbers will be limited at gate (example: 100 visitors per gate every 2 hours).
7. Social distancing, Tobacco Awareness, hand washing and "No Dogs on Fairgrounds" signs will be hung throughout fairgrounds.
8. Loud speaker will broadcast reminders for hand washing and social distancing throughout the fairgrounds every half hour.
9. Livestock show will run in the manner of a jack-pot show. Animals will come in at 8 AM on their actual show day. They will be tagged and weighed using social distancing measures. The showmanship, market and breeding classes will follow beginning 1 hour after weigh-ins are completed. Upon completion of show animals must be removed from the fairground. The horse show will run in the same manner – no animals will be allowed to remain on grounds (except by permission from fair manager).
10. No camping will be available for livestock exhibitors on grounds (except by permission from fair manager).
11. Animals will be allowed to return to fairgrounds after 5pm on Saturday (July 18th) in preparation for the Livestock Auction which will be held on Sunday
12. The Livestock Auction will be held on Sunday as in the past. The layout will utilize a larger area, perhaps the entire Pavilion, to accommodate social distancing. The 4-H breakfast and dessert area will be housed on the lawn to help facilitate social distancing. 21. Vendor Camping area will be held to same standard as Livestock camping.

PLAN D: Jack-pot type livestock show and regular livestock auction – No Fair

1. Livestock Show will run in the manner of a Jack-Pot show. Animals will come in at 8 AM on their actual show day. They will be tagged and weighed using social distancing measures. The showmanship, market and breeding classes will follow beginning 1 hours after weigh-ins are completed. Upon completion of show animals must be removed from the fairground. The horse show will run in the same manner – no animals will be allowed to remain on grounds (except by permission from fair manager).
2. Hand washing stations will be distributed throughout the fairgrounds (barns, show areas and midway). Number of stations will depend on availability through sanitation agencies.
3. Where possible, ground will be taped or marked for social distancing.
4. Buildings and barns will be monitored by staff and/or volunteers to limit number of visitors.
5. No camping will be available for livestock exhibitors on grounds (except by permission from fair manager).
6. Animals will be allowed to return to fairgrounds after 5pm on Saturday (July 18th) in preparation for the Livestock Auction which will be held on Sunday.
7. The Livestock Auction will be held on Sunday as in the past. The layout will utilize a larger area, perhaps the entire Pavilion, to accommodate social distancing. The 4-H breakfast and dessert area will be housed on the lawn to help facilitate social distancing. The 4-H volunteers will develop a social distancing plan for their part of the event as will the Junior Livestock Committee.

14. Work with 4-H, FFA, the County Office of Education and other community groups to put on a "Fall Extravaganza". This event will include the 4-H BBQ and other community activities (car show, Children's Day, etc) and will enable those entering still exhibits to have an opportunity to show their work.

PLAN E: Virtual Show and Livestock Auction – No regular fair

1. Prepare and conduct the Livestock Show and Auction virtually.
2. Work with the Junior Livestock Auction Committee, 4-H and FFA to ensure a successful event for all exhibitors.
3. Work with 4-H, FFA, the County Office of Education and other community groups to put on a "Fall Extravaganza". This event will include the 4-H BBQ and other community activities (car show, Children's Day, etc) and will enable those entering still exhibits to have an opportunity to show their work.
