

Dear Lassen County Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to you as a resident and ratepayer of the Clear Creek Community Services District (CSD). As the 60-day period for the CSD to fill its two open board vacancies has expired under California Government Code Section 1780, the authority to fill these vacancies now rests entirely with the Board of Supervisors.

I am urgently requesting that the Board thoroughly vet the two applicants seeking these seats—**Kevin Kassel** and **Debra Erikson**—due to a severe, disqualifying conflict of interest that threatens the independent oversight of our district.

Both **Kevin Kassel** and **Debra Erikson** have direct, personal financial relationships with the household of the Clear Creek CSD General Manager. Specifically, the General Manager's wife who has organized and managed personal GoFundMe crowdfunding campaigns for both individuals.

The primary legal duty of the CSD Board of Directors is to oversee, evaluate, and hold the General Manager accountable. It is an ethical and structural impossibility for appointed directors to remain impartial when evaluating their executive employee if that employee's immediate family handles their personal or medical fundraising. Appointing Mr. Kassel and Ms. Erikson would effectively allow the General Manager to pack his own governing board with financially entangled neighbors, destroying any semblance of public transparency, checks and balances, or objective oversight.

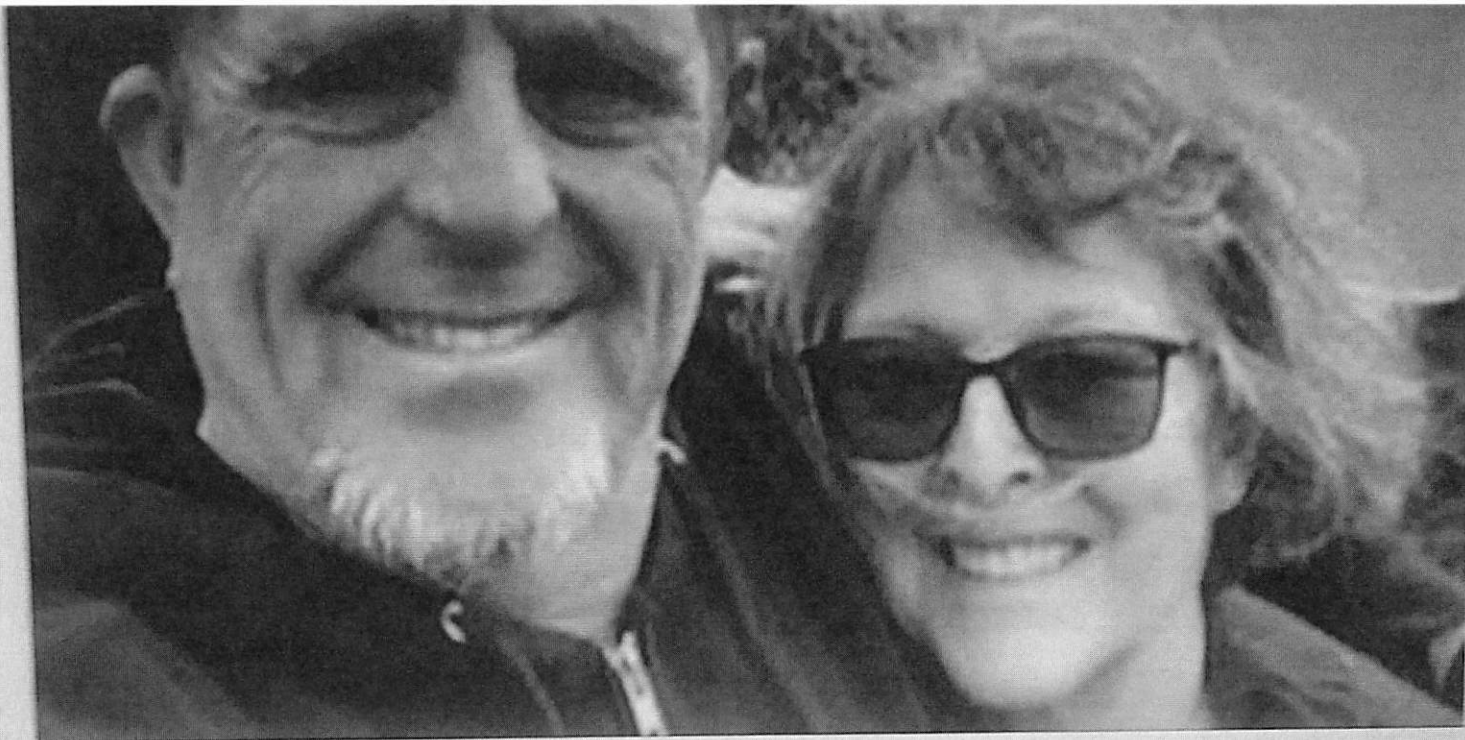
Given the intense community scrutiny regarding our water infrastructure and district management, we need completely neutral, independent board members. I urge the Board of Supervisors to:

1. Formally question **Kevin Kassel** and **Debra Erikson** on the public record regarding their financial and personal ties to the General Manager's household.
2. Require a full disclosure of all crowdfunding and fundraising accounts managed by the GM's family on behalf of these applicants.
3. Consider opening the application window to wider community members who do not possess these glaring conflicts of interest.

Thank you for your time, your oversight, and your commitment to protecting local governance in Lassen County.
