Background:

On January 9th the Board of Supervisors approved Lassen County's Child and Family Services Review System Improvement Plan (SIP). This plan included Program Descriptions and expenditure recommendations for the Federal Child Abuse Prevention Intervention and Treatment (CAPIT) allocation.

Since then Lassen County Child and Family Services has worked with Sierra Cascade Family Opportunities (Head Start) and other community partners to plan and host the first annual Family Connections Conference on April 21, 2018.

After consultation the California Department of Social Services and with their approval of the attached CAPIT Program Description for the Family Connections Conference, Lassen County Child and Family Services is seeking approval from the Board of Supervisors to utilize unspent Federal CAPIT funds to support the Family Connections Conference.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Family Connection Conference is a free event for all parents in our community. It is a collaborative effort among community organizations whose shared vision is to provide opportunities to strengthen families. Our theme for this year is "Linking Together to Build Strong Families".

The Family Connections Conference uses the National Strengthening Families Framework to guide the focus of the event. Strengthening Families is a research-informed approach to increase family strengths, enhance child development and reduce the likelihood of child abuse and neglect. It is based on engaging families, programs and communities in building the five protective factors. This event is a key initiative to bring together programs and families in an engaging way. Our vision is that parents will walk away with strong connections to each other, linkages to the community, and inspiration as they raise our children and our future.

The day will begin with a Parent Café where parents can engage with each other promoting the protective factors of ***Social Connections*** and ***Parental Resilience***. A Keynote Presentation by a Parenting Expert will inspire parents and promote ***Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development***. Time will be set aside for families to explore Resource Booths to be connected to community resources for ***Concrete Support in Times of Need***. Parents will engage in a fun activity called the Brain Architecture Game that helps them understand their child's brain development and how they can support the ***Social and Emotional Competence of Children***.

Our target is to have a minimum of 50 parents attend, however, we have the capacity for 100+. We will be offering meals and give away items that families can take home to support their parenting.




