**THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LASSEN
ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION ONE: This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of its adoption. Before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its adoption a summary shall be published with the names of the members voting for and against the same, once in a local newspaper of the County of Lassen, State of California.

SECTION TWO: Section 18.108.230 of the Lassen County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

18.108.230 Keeping animals-Special provisions

- (a) Unless otherwise provided in this title, the following regulations shall apply to the keeping of animals on a property:
- (1) The minimum lot area upon which a horse, cow, ostrich, llama, alpaca or other large animal may be kept is one acre, and two large animals may be kept on such area. One additional large animal may be kept for each twenty thousand square feet by which a parcel of land exceeds one acre.
 - (2) Stables shall be located midway between the side lot lines, but in no case closer than twenty feet to the side lot lines, and not closer than fifty feet to the front lot line.
 - (3) Not more than one goat, or one hog, or one sheep or similar livestock shall be kept for every seven thousand square feet of area. Such area requirements shall not include the special setback requirements of this Title, nor the area occupied by the main building;

SECTION THREE: Section 18.14.1110 of the Lassen County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Small livestock farming" means the raising and/or keeping of more than twelve chicken hens or twelve pigeons or twelve similar fowl and/or twelve rabbits or twelve similar animals or any roosters, quacking ducks, geese, guinea fowl, peafowl, goats, sheep or similar livestock; or the raising and/or keeping for commercial purposes of any cats or dogs; provided, that the term "small livestock farming" as used in this title does not include hog farming, dairying or the raising and/or keeping of horses, mules, alpacas or similar livestock as determined by the board of supervisors.

SECTION FOUR: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional and invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and every section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

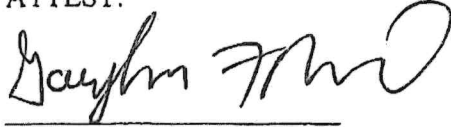

SUBJECT: Ordinance amending County Code Sections 18.108.230 (Keeping animals-Special provisions), 18.14.1110 (Small livestock farming).

Summary:

At the March 24, 2026, Lassen County Board of Supervisors meeting, an Interpretive Action regarding the classification of alpacas was made. The Board of Supervisors determined alpacas are to be classified as large livestock. This proposed zoning amendment to Lassen County Code is being made to clarify that alpacas are classified as large livestock. The two sections of County Code that this proposed zoning amendment amends are summarized as follows:

- Section Two of the proposed ordinance adds alpacas to the list of large animals in Section 18.108.230(a)(1).
- Section Three of the proposed ordinance amends Section 18.14.1110, adding alpacas to the list of animals not to be termed small livestock farming.

Adoption Process:

The proposed ordinance is being considered in accordance with section 65853 et seq (Zoning Amendment Procedures) of the California Government Code. In summary, both the Planning Commission and the Board must each conduct a public hearing before said ordinance can be adopted. In accordance with section 65857, the Board of Supervisors can introduce and adopt the ordinance at the same meeting. However, the Board must refer the proposed ordinance back to the Planning Commission, if the Board wishes to consider modifications to the proposed ordinance not considered by the Planning Commission.

California Environmental Quality Act:

The Environmental Review Officer (ERO) has determined that this proposed amendment is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3).

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Section 15061(b)(3) states that “...*CEQA applies only to projects, which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.*” The proposed amendment makes minor adjustments to County Code that will not have a significant environmental affect.

(b)

The density limitations listed above shall not apply to targeted grazing, provided said targeted grazing lasts no longer than thirty days in any single calendar year on any single parcel.

SUBJECT: Interpretive Action and determination to be made by the Board of Supervisors in accordance with Lassen County Code Section 18.122.040 and 18.14.1110, regarding the classification of alpacas as either small or large livestock. The number of animals that may be kept is impacted by this classification. Assessor Parcel Number 135-190-027, 449-585 Hamlin Rd. Milford, CA, 96121.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

ACTION REQUESTED: 1) Receive report; and 2) determine whether an alpaca shall be classified as a small or large livestock animal.

Planning and Building Services Associate Planner Mindie Hilton read the subject and action requested of the agenda item and stated the Lassen County Code did not define an alpaca as large or small livestock. The request was for the board to make that determination and to create a density to have per acre for the health of the animals and health of the ground. Planner Hilton gave a brief overview of the alpaca. Supervisor Albaugh stated there were several types of animals on the property in addition to the alpacas. CAO Anderson confirmed there were multiple types of livestock. Director of Planning and Building Services Gaylon Norwood gave an explanation animal per acre. CAO Anderson

reminded the board the item being presented was to solely consider if an alpaca was a large or small animal. Additional discussion was held pertaining to small and large livestock. Supervisor Ingram made a motion to determine the alpaca was a large animal. Supervisor Albaugh made substitute motion that the Lassen County Code sections 18.122.040 and 18.14.1110 to include the alpaca to be classified as a large livestock animal. Supervisor withdrew his initial motion.

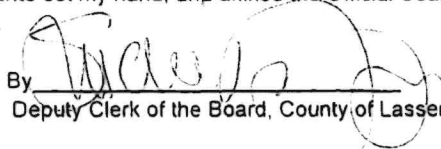
