



Proclamation

HONORING

VETERANS DAY 2024

Whereas, in the United States of America, Veterans Day annually falls on November 11. This day is the anniversary of signing of the armistice, which ended the World War I hostilities between the Allied Nations and Germany in 1918; and,

Whereas, as a Nation facing the world of Global Terrorism in the 21st Century, the **Veterans** of that First World War are but a memory and the dangers we face today are very different from those faced in prior wars; and,

Whereas, loyal citizens from every corner of **America** have assumed the duty of military life, from World War I and World War II; to the conflicts in Korea, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf and the ongoing battles in the War on Terror in Iraq, Afghanistan and around the world; our military has built a great tradition of courageous and faithful service; and,
