SUBJECT: Rezone lands within Lassen County owned by the Freitas Family Trust into an Agricultural Preserve Combining District (A-P) and allow these lands to be entered into a new Land Conservation (Williamson Act) contract. SUBJECT: Rezone lands within Lassen County owned by Wynn and Tamsen Myers into an Agricultural Preserve Combining District (A-P) and allow these lands to be entered into a new Land Conservation (Williamson Act) contract.
