### **Budget Narrative**

We have prepared our 2022/2023 grant period budget to accomplish the following goals:

- Support the Program's objectives and activities;
- To minimize administrative costs and support direct services;
- > To support the duties and time commitments of project-funded staff to meet the proposed objectives and activities.

We anticipate salary adjustments in the program for our full-time Mass Victimization/ Victim- Witness Advocate (MVA/VWA) at 1 FTE.

#### PERSONAL COSTS

### TOTAL ALLOCATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES: \$186,722.00

The budget was calculated to cover the salaries and benefits of the following positions/ full-time equivalent percentages as well as the following amounts for PERS Unfunded Retirement Liability and Workers Compensation Insurance attributable to the Lassen County Victim/ Witness Assistance Program (LCVW).

<u>Victim/ Witness Program Coordinator</u>: The Coordinator will be 100% 1 FTE position within our program. The Coordinator is compensated at the Lassen County UPEC Range 20, Step G. The base salary for this position is \$5233 for the

entire 12-month grant period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023. Therefore, the total salary for the Coordinator will be \$62,796. The Coordinator receives a longevity increase of 10% over the course of the entire grant period for a total of an additional \$6,279.60. The Victim/ Witness Program Coordinator total salary equals \$69,075.60, which is rounded up to \$69,076.00. The Coordinator receives benefits from the county that includes retirement, Social Security, Medicare, health/dental/vision/life insurance and other personnel employee benefits for \$24,590.00 or 35.6%. The total salaries and benefits for the Coordinator position will be \$93,666.00 and will be paid 90% utilizing 20 VOCA funds and 10% utilizing 22 VOCA funds. Due to the Coordinator supervising the VWA/MVA as well as working directly on mass crisis response objectives, 10% of the salary and benefits will be allocated to the MVA funds (22 VOCA) for a total of \$9,367.00.

The Victim/ Witness Coordinator/ Advocate will be responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Victim/ Witness grant project, supervise the Victim/ Witness Advocate/Mass Victimization Advocate, as well as any Volunteers within the program. They will carry an advocacy caseload, which will provide direct advocacy services to the victims of crime who request services from our program. Administrative duties shall include, but are not limited to, the



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responsibility for project reporting; overseeing the grant project, including compliance issues; overseeing the delivery of services; coordination of community outreach projects; overseeing training of staff and the training of outside agencies; provide direct services to victims of crime pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 - 13835.5 and Penal Code 679-680 and other administrative duties as they arise. The Coordinator also attends as many of the trainings regarding mass victimization and spends a portion of their time specifically with the VWA/MVA to work on protocols, plans, outreach and engagement with local agencies.

Victim Witness/ Mass Victimization Advocate (VWA/MVA): The VWA/MVA will be 100% 1 FTE position within our program. The VWA/MVA is compensated at the Lassen County UPEC Range 15, Step B for 5 months at a base salary of \$3,313 and will move to a Range 15, Step C for the remaining 7 months at a base salary of \$3,468. The total salary for the VWA/MVA will be \$40,841.00. The VWA/MVA receives benefits from the county that includes retirement, Social Security, Medicare, health/dental/vision/life insurance and other personnel employee benefits for \$19,915 or 48.8%.



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The total salaries and benefits for the VWA/MVA position will be \$60,756 and will be paid 100% utilizing 22 VOCA funds. The MVA/VWA position is funded with 20% of the MVA funds (22 VOCA) for a total of \$12,151.00.

The Mass Victimization Advocate will maintain a crisis response/ mass victimization plan for Lassen County; update LCVW protocols when responding to a mass victimization incident; create MOU's with community agencies, law enforcement, local school districts and neighboring counties; attend and conduct outreach events regarding crisis response/ mass victimization. The VWA/MVA will be working on crisis response job duties 20% or 8 hours a week and 80% or 32 hours a week providing direct services to victims of crime pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 - 13835.5 and Penal Code 679-680; and will carry the bulk of the caseload for the program.

District Attorney Program Manager/ Routine Fiscal Position: The fiscal position will be at .05 FTE (or 2 hours a week) within our program. The fiscal position is compensated at the Lassen County Mid-management Range 22, Step G for 12 months. The base salary for this position is \$5,578 for the entire 12-month grant period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 at 5% for a total of \$3,346.80. The fiscal position receives a salary longevity increase of 2.5% for the

entire 12-month grant period for a total of an additional \$83.67. The fiscal position total salary equals \$3,430.47, which is rounded to \$3,430.00. The fiscal position receives benefits from the county that includes retirement, Social Security, Medicare, health/dental/vision/life insurance and other personnel employee benefits at 5% for our program in the amount of \$1,173 or 34.2% of their salary. The total salaries and benefits for the fiscal position will be \$4,603.00 and will be utilizing 100% 20 VOCA funds.

The District Attorney Program Manager/ Fiscal will be responsible for the fiscal responsibilities of the Victim/ Witness grant project. Duties shall include, but are not limited to, reviewing 2-201's; receiving/ depositing 2-201 funds; preparing Victim/ Witness invoices (travel expenses, postage expenses and 2-201's); assisting with the Victim/ Witness RFA; reconciling the Victim/ Witness emergency fund bank account; assist with monitoring the grant and county budget; and other administrative duties as they arise.

PERS Unfunded Retirement Liability: The total PERS Unfunded Retirement Liability expenses that are attributable to the project as estimated by the County of Lassen is \$24,473. The retirement liability costs will be paid 71% utilizing 20 VOCA funds and utilizing 21% 22 VOCA funds. If we remove 5%



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(\$1224) of the PERS Unfunded Retirement that is attributed to the DA Program Coordinator that leaves \$23,249. Due to 30% of staff is funded out of the MVA funds (22 VOCA); \$23,249 x 30% equals \$6,974.70 (\$6,975).

Workers Compensation Insurance: The total Worker's Compensation
Insurance expenses that County of Lassen has attributed to this project are
\$3,224.00. The insurance costs will be paid 71% utilizing 20 VOCA funds and
utilizing 29% 22 VOCA funds. If we remove 5% (\$161) of the Workers

Compensation Insurance that is attributed to the DA Program Coordinator that
leaves \$3,063. Due to 30% of staff is funded out of the MVA funds (22 VOCA);
\$3,063 x 30% equals \$918.90 (\$919).

### **OPERATING COSTS**

TOTAL ALLOCATION FOR OPERATING EXPENSES: \$48,394.00

We are dedicating only a small percentage (21%) or our total grant funds to operating expenses, only those minimum amounts necessary to support the program and provide services to victims. We are committed to dedicating the largest percentage of our total grant funds to PERSONNEL COSTS, in furtherance of the grant's objectives.

Our operating costs will be:

Communications (Office Phones): We are allocating \$540.00 for the programs use of the county phone system. This amount will cover the cost of the public phone number used by all Victim/Witness Staff and Volunteers as well as a private phone number for the Coordinator and the VWA/MVA. Therefore, the total of \$540.00 is being charged to the grant for this purpose. The costs of communications will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VOCA funds.

<u>Liability Insurance</u>: The liability insurance costs attributed to this program by the County of Lassen will be \$1200.00. The costs of this insurance will be covered by utilizing 25% 22 VOCA funds and 75% 22 VWA0 funds.

Office Supplies: We are allocating \$1500.00 for office supplies (copy/printer paper, printer toner, pens, file folders, labels...etc.) to be used for Victim/Witness. The total of \$1500.00 is being charged to the grant for this purpose. \$1200 is allocated for the costs attributable to the program and \$300 is attributable to MVA purposes for go-bags updates, paper, pens, and folders. The costs of office supplies will be covered by utilizing 92% 22 VOCA funds (\$300 will be used for MVA) and utilizing 8% 22 VWAO funds.

<u>Cell Phone Service</u>: We are allocating **\$996.00** for extending the cellular service and data plan through the end of the grant project. Victim/ Witness has



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Straight talk cell phones for the staff (Coordinator and VWA/MVA) to utilize to contact clients, law enforcement or the main office when out of the office providing outreach for mass crisis incidents and to be available if an incident occurs. The cellular/ data plan cost \$41.50 a month per phone. The costs of the cell service will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VOCA funds.

<u>Postage</u>: We are allocating \$519.00 for postage. Victim/Witness sends out numerous correspondences through metered mail because of being in such a rural county. Therefore, the total amount for postage will be \$519.00. The costs of postage will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VWA0 funds.

Informational Technology (IT) Direct Billing: The IT direct billing is to cover the cost of internet services, email access through Outlook, Office 365 (Word, Excel...), anti-virus and system storage/ back up that will be set-up and maintained through our county IT department. Each county staff workstation (desktops, laptops or tablets) is charged the same amount for all of the services, which is \$2,250, no matter their FTE status. Victim/Witness will have two desktops attributable to the project and two mobile devices (2 SurfacePro's) attributable to the project for mass crisis response, so the cost of the IT direct billing is \$9,000.00. The costs of the IT direct billing will be covered by utilizing 56% 22



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VOCA funds (\$4500.00 to be covered with MVA funds) and utilizing 44% 22 VWA0 funds.

Indirect Costs (A-87): The Indirect Costs attributed to this program by the County of Lassen will be \$21,756.00. The Indirect Cost Rate will be 10% de Minimis of the project. Lassen County is charging our grant project \$21,756 to cover any costs associated but not limited to services for: Lassen County Administration, Lassen County Auditor, Lassen County-County Counsel, Lassen County Board of Supervisors, maintaining facility/grounds, and janitorial services. The indirect costs will be covered by utilizing 14% 20 VOCA funds, utilizing 18% 22 VOCA funds and utilizing 68% 22 VWA0 funds.

<u>Transportation:</u> We are allocating \$1,350.00 for the purpose of purchasing fuel for the VW vehicle. Lassen County is rural and some areas are more than 70 miles each way from our office in Susanville. We are anticipating utilizing 220 gallons of fuel at \$5.50 a gallon for a total of \$1,210. In addition, we anticipate having bi-quarter oil changes with tire rotations at \$70 each for \$140.00. The total for the cost of transportation is \$1,350.00. The costs of the fuel will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VOCA funds (50% or \$675.00 will be utilizing MVA funds).



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Travel/Training: We are allocating an ESTIMATED amount of \$8,554.00 for anticipated training costs. Due to the current Covid-19 pandemic we are unable to give a detail of the training we anticipate sending our staff to.

However, we will have a newer advocate and know that there are some trainings that they will need to attend throughout the year. We came to the estimate based on the costs over the past few years to send staff to certain trainings throughout the state. We are allocating \$5054 for Victim Witness trainings and \$3500 for Mass Crisis Response trainings. We hope to have our staff participate in the following trainings but not limited to just these topics:

- Entry Level Advocacy (if our advocate cannot get into Sept.
   2022 training)
- CCVAA Crisis Response Phase II
- Elder Physical and Financial Abuse
- Domestic Violence and Stalking
- Sexual Assault
- Child Physical and Sexual Abuse
- FEMA emergency response
- Mass Victimization Summit
- <u>Victim Advocacy Institute</u>



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- CCVAA online webinars
- CDAA Victim Advocate webinars
- Quarterly Regional Coordinator/ MVA meetings
- And any additional victim related trainings that could benefit our staff to serve our victims

These travel expenses; we will utilize the travel policy of LASSEN COUNTY.

For these expenses, we will utilize 12% 20 VOCA funds and utilizing 88% 22 VOCA funds (\$3500 will be utilizing MVA funds or 41% of 22 VOCA funds).

Memberships: We are allocating \$267.00 for membership fees for California District Attorneys Association for the Coordinator (\$88) and the VWA/MVA (\$44). Therefore, the total of \$267.00. The costs of memberships will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VOCA funds.

Karpel Data Base System: We are allocating \$1,128.00 for covering the cost Karpel (database that the Lassen County District Attorney's Office and LCVW uses to keep track of defendants and victims that were referred by law enforcement for criminal charges.) Karpel charges an annual fee of \$550.00 per user to have access to log in information, including victim statistics. LCVW will have 2.05 users, 1 Coordinator, 1 VWA/MVA in Karpel as well as the 5% of LCDA



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Program Coordinator. \$550 times two equals \$1,100.00 and 5% of \$550 is \$28 for a total of \$1,128.00. The cost of \$1,128.00 is billable to LCVW. The costs of Karpel will be covered by utilizing 100% 20 VOCA funds.

Copier Expense: We are allocating \$1,065.00 for the purpose of covering the cost of the copier lease and maintenance for the Lassen County District Attorney's Office, which LCVW is, one of four divisions that utilize the copier on a daily basis. The cost of the copier for a year is \$4,259.20, if you divide it by the 4 divisions it would be a cost of \$1,065 billable to LCVW. The costs of the copier expenses will be covered by utilizing 100% 20 VOCA funds.

Business Cards and Apparel: We are allocating \$519.00 for covering the cost of business cards for our VWA/MVA as well as staff shirts and sweatshirt for outreach, trainings and mass victimization incidents. The cards and apparel will be purchased through Vista Print but due to not knowing how many items we will need and the changing price of products/ shipping we will not be exceeding \$519.00. The costs of the business cards and apparel will be covered by utilizing 100% 22 VOCA funds.

Lassen County Victim/Witness Assistance Program (LCVW) plans to provide all mandatory services as outlined in the RFA and pursuant to California Penal Code Section 13835.4 through 13835.5. Our program is staffed by a 1 F.T.E. Mass Victimization/ Victim-Witness Advocate (VWA/MVA). This advocate will handle a full caseload as well as works 8 hours a week learning, participating in meetings and outreach about mass victimization and will be working on our protocols, procedures and MOU's. As well as 1 F.T.E. Coordinator who handles the daily programmatic duties as well as carries a caseload and who will be working 4 hours a week supervising and training the VWA/MVA regarding our crisis response protocols, procedures and MOU's.

Our program reaches out to victims to inform them of their rights as a victim, and extend services that the victim may need immediately or in the future. Our program communicates with victims over the phone, via email, regular mail and in-person when safety precautions are met.

The VWA/MVA will, hopefully, have completed Entry Level training and inhouse training regarding Crisis Response Advocate Training Phase I. If the advocate has not completed Entry Level, then they will complete it once it becomes available as well as Crisis Response Advocate Training Phase II. The

Coordinator has completed Entry Level Training, Advanced Training,

Coordinator Training and CCVAA Crisis Response Advocate Training and has

attended some local meetings and trainings related to emergency response for

Lassen County.

Our program will continue to provide education through outreach efforts to address the needs of victims in our outlining communities within Lassen County. We plan to continue providing education through community outreach events when possible to inform our community of the resources that are available locally and statewide over the course of the 2022/2023 grant year.

Regarding our mass victimization plan, due to COVID our community partners had been busy with trying to maintain safety and order during the pandemic. This has caused some things, like mass victimization, not be a priority. Over the 2021/2022 grant year, we started the process of training a new advocate to provide victim/witness services as well as learn about mass victimization and their roles and responsibilities. Our program is working on reconnecting with our law enforcement and county emergency partners in order to participate in trainings and meetings addressing a mass victimization event. Our VWA/MVA will split their time 80%/20% (8 hours a week for MVA and



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32 hours a week for VWA). Our goal is to have our advocate trained in crisis response I (trained in-house) as well as any additional trainings/ webinars pertaining to mass victimization incidents/ responses prior to the 2022/2023 grant year. Our program remains dedicated to address victims needs and the importance of being prepared if/when a mass victimization incident occurs. We will only be utilizing MVA funds for 10% of the coordinator's salary and benefits it takes to supervise and train the new VWA/MVA and 20% of the VWA/MVA salary and benefits. We will be modifying our protocol/ plan to reflect the changes in staffing and have a new LCVW protocol/ plan approved by the Lassen County District Attorney. The revised plan will be dispersed to Law Enforcement and our county emergency partners.

Our VWA/MVA will participate in any related trainings via in-person or webinars that are relevant to mass victimization such as: secondary trauma, grief and recovery, death notifications and related FEMA trainings.

We will be working with Lassen County Emergency Preparedness staff to be included into the county emergency response plan. We want to introduce ourselves to our county school districts and see if we can work with them to be included on their emergency response plan. We will participate in any mass



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victimization or simulations available in our county. We will also be updating our go-bags with current forms and any items that may be expired.

We feel we will be able to meet our goals and objectives regarding providing all of the mandatory services outlined in the RFA during the 2022/2023 grant performance period.



Our program provides services pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 - 13835.5. We assist victims of crime by educating people on the criminal justice system, victim's rights (Marsy's Law), provide local/ state/national resources and referrals for services, assist victims with obtaining their property previously held as evidence, attend court, law enforcement interviews and attorney interviews with victims, provide victims with timely information about their case and possible resolutions and assist victims with making a request for restitution.

7. Describe practical/logistical obstacles and/or local resource constraints to providing match:

Lassen County is a large county, yet, very rural. About half of the population resides in the county seat, Susanville; the other half reside in unincorporated towns that span 5 to 77+ miles from Susanville. Our county does not have what many would call a "large city" and we only have a community college; these are obstacles when trying to find qualified interns and volunteers to assist our program in the ways of in-kind match. Our program is housed within the Lassen County District Attorney's Department; being able to accept donations for cash match becomes difficult. Due to the pandemic our county is asking departments to cut their budget. The county is not in a position to assist with the amount of match VOCA is requiring. We have utilized volunteers in the past to meet our in-kind match, with events slowing starting back up, finding volunteers to help with outreach is very difficult.
