Founded in Denver in 1887, United Way is the world's largest privately funded non-profit, and the largest non-government funder of human services. Our mission is to "fight for the health, education and financial stability of every person in our community." We do that by working in close collaboration with non-profit partners, government agencies and the business community to advocate for, support and deliver programs and resources that help improve lives.

United Way of Northern California (UWNC) serves Lassen County and eight others in our region – Butte, Glenn, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Siskiyou, Tehama and Trinity. UWNC is one of 1,200 local United Ways in the United States. Another 600 United Ways operate in 40 more countries around the globe. While the movement is worldwide, all money raised by UWNC is spent locally, unless designated otherwise by donors. And all operational decisions are made by a Board of Directors made up of local volunteers.

Our work is made possible largely through our Workplace Giving Campaign. Lassen County Employees have joined in this effort; currently, 20 of your employees are participating and have been for several years. This has allowed us to support partner agencies like Lassen Family Services, and to help fund our own programs such as 2-1-1 NorCal – a program that we very much would like to expand to Lassen County.

Indeed, this year we aim to increase our impact in our less-populated counties, including Lassen. We have been able to make some progress by aligning key partners to this campaign such as the Walmart in Susanville, Lassen County Office of Education and Lassen Community College. Having the full support of the Lassen County Board of Supervisors for this year's campaign, we believe, will ensure a very successful 2017 campaign year. That in turn will allow us to return the investment as we operate and support social programs that help the community and its citizens.

We ask for your continued support of our Workplace Campaign and look forward to working yet more closely with all who want to build community in Lassen County.
