

- · Codified in 2016 by AB 442 (Irwin)

- Members: Retired Flag Officers, Former Senior DOD Executives, Bipartisan Legislative Leadership, Industry Leaders

Mission

- Articulate the defense value of California installations.
- Strengthen industrial base supporting military.
- · Lead state actions to improve operating environment.

Key Activities


- Visit bases and military communities



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


