Program Narrative

The spring and summer of the year 2017 was a successful season for our Boating Program. After struggling to employ Peace Officers during the Spring/Summer of 2016, we completed the 2017 season with three (3) Full-Time Boating Deputy Sheriffs and supplemented staff with a Captain and Deputy Sheriffs. We are looking to increase our activity and employment with the Boating program going into the 2018/2019.

Our Boating Safety and Enforcement Program provides assistance to nine (9) bodies of water. We do this with the assistance of the following boats: two large watercraft, a medium size watercraft, an inflatable watercraft, two small aluminum watercraft and a "mud boat" watercraft. These vessels enable us to operate in all bodies of water, each unique in size, make-up and water levels.

Although all bodies of water are open year around, the majority are not populated until the late spring due to fishing seasons and water temperature. Eagle Lake is the largest body of water in Lassen County and makes up the largest population of visitors due to its recreational and sport opportunities.

Our program is staffed by one full-time seasonal Deputy at Blue Lake and two full-time seasonal 830.1(a) PC seasonal Deputy Sheriffs that rotate around the waterways to be patrolled. This staff is supported by administrative clerical position, a Captain and additional rotating Deputy Sheriffs. The Captain is responsible for the oversight of the boating program and responsibilities. Daily duties of the Deputies assigned to this unit consist of, but not limited to; pre-launching boating safety inspections, on and off water education, preventative enforcement, compliance checks, vessel inspections, vessel patrols and rescue operations for boaters or vessels in need.

The full-time season typically begins by April of each year with Deputies placing hazard, advisory and enforcement buoys throughout the bodies of water. Full-time scheduling will begin

the weekend of Memorial Day, through November of each year. During the months in between the season, personnel are assigned to respond to the bodies of water as needed.

This coming year, we will be requesting to add a Boating Safety Officer who will supplement the two (3) full-time/Seasonal Deputy Sheriffs. This will enable us to expand our efforts throughout the nine (9) lakes that we serve under this Aid program. We will additionally be seeking to supplement another Boating Safety Officer during this fiscal period.

In the past years, the emphasis of the program has been on prevention, enforcement and education. However, enforcement has not been proactive in the form of punitive enforcement (enforcement citations). During the 2018-19 fiscal year, we will be putting more emphasis on enforcement activity on all of our waters. This will include an increase in warning and punitive citations. We will continue to provide educational opportunities for members of the community, along with vessel law compliance and inspections as well. Furthermore, one of the two full-time Deputy Sheriff's assigned to this Aid program has already attended the Boating While under the Influence course. We plan additional Full-time Deputy Sheriffs to this training in the spring of 2018. We will also be sending Deputy Sheriffs to the Vessel Accident Investigation course during the year of 2018.

The significant weakness in our program is the lack of a dependable large vessel for the Eagle Lake patrol. We currently utilize two (2) 1993 Design Concept deep V hull boats that are continually aging and in need of constant repair. We supplement these boats with a 2001 Jetcraft medium V boat that is unable to handle the extreme conditions that sometimes occur at this lake. In 2017, we applied for a new vessel for our Boating Safety and Enforcement program. Although our application was denied, we will continue to apply for these funds while they are available as we continue to strengthen our program.

We look forward to another successful year in our Boating Safety and Enforcement Program with the Division of Boating and Waterways. We will strengthening our program and utilize the funds that have been provided to our community through this program.
