Dear Board Members:

This is to inform you that on Thursday, May 10, 2018, at approximately 0754 hours, approximately 10 gallons of diesel fuel leaked onto the asphalt/dirt shoulder, on the south side of Johnstonville Road, at the intersection with Big Sky Boulevard. The spill was a result of a two vehicle traffic collision, involving a 1988 Peterbuilt and a 2012 Peterbuilt. Stoneco Construction immediately responded to the scene and placed absorbent pads and dirt to contain the spilled fuel. Stoneco Construction returned on May 11, 2018, dug out the contaminated soil, conducted soil testing and replaced with clean soil.

This report is submitted pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 25180.7 (Proposition 65). The report documents information regarding the discharge of hazardous material which could cause substantial injury to the public health or safety. The report is submitted on behalf of all designated employees of the Department of the California Highway Patrol.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENT REPORT:

May 10, 2018

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS:

On May 10, 2018, at approximately 0754 hours, Mr. Dinty Moore was driving a truck tractor/semi trailer combination, eastbound on Johnstonville Rd. approaching the intersection of Big Sky Blvd. Mr. Jerome Bryant was driving a three axle truck eastbound on Johnstonville Rd. behind Moore. Moore began to slow and veered to the left in preparation to turn right onto Big Sky Blvd. Bryant drove to the right of Moore. Due to Bryant's unsafe passing on the right a collision occurred with the right side of Moore's vehicle and the left side of Bryant's vehicle. Both vehicles came to rest, on their wheels, within the intersection of Johnstonville Rd. and Big Sky Blvd. The collision caused a puncture to the right saddle tank of Moore's vehicle and a fuel line break on Bryant's vehicle. Approximately 10 gallons of diesel fuel leaked out of the saddle tank onto the roadway. A small amount of fuel leaked from the broken fuel line onto the roadway. The diesel fuel leaked downgrade in a southwesterly direction on the west roadway edge of Big Sky Blvd. and into the dirt shoulder.

ROAD CLOSURE INFORMATION:

One-way traffic control was utilized for approximately one hour.

EVACUATION DETAILS:

There were no evacuations.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

Approximately 10 gallons of diesel fuel were spilled and eventually drained into the north dirt shoulder. First responders built a berm out of dirt and leaves to slow the flow of the diesel and to block the diesel from draining into a culvert located on the north dirt shoulder approximately 60 feet downhill from the scene. Later, absorbent pads and booms were used to collect the diesel/precipitation mixture. It appeared the diesel was contained to the dirt shoulder. The culvert showed no evidence of diesel fuel contamination.

CLEAN-UP ACTIONS:

The trucking company (Stoneco Construction) immediately responded to the scene and placed absorbent pads and dirt to contain the spilled fuel.

Stoneco Construction is planning on responding the next day to dig out the contaminated soil, conduct soil testing, and replace with clean soil.
