HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENT REPORT:

NARRATIVE:

Sequence of Events:

On February 7, 2019, at 2241 hours, Party #1 (Dorogam) was driving Vehicle #1 (Freightliner) southbound on US-395, north of SR-70, at 65 miles-per-hour. Party #2 (Uren, D.) was driving Vehicle #2 (Volvo) northbound on US-395, south of P1. at 55-58 miles-per-hour. For an unknown reason, P1 drove V1 across the solid yellow center line, directly in front of V2. P2 took evasive action by swerving to the east shoulder, but was unable to avoid a collision with V1 and the left side of V1 struck the left side of V2. P1 brought V1 to a stop on the west shoulder of US-395 approximately 1,200 feet south of the collision scene. V1 sustained moderate damage to the left side of the tractor and trailer, to include: driver's side mirror, left cab body, front and left side of van trailer body, and right rear van trailer door. P2 brought V2 to a stop on the east shoulder of US-395 at the collision scene. V2 sustained moderate damage to the left side of the tractor and trailer, to include: driver's side mirror, left cab body, front and left side of trailer van body, broken trailer frame. Due to the collision, P2 had the vehicle load become compromised and approximately 75 gallons of Sherman Williams Paint products spilled onto the roadway. The broken trailer frame caused the diesel tank under the trailer designated for the axillary heater to be crushed. Approximately 15 gallons of diesel fuel spilled onto the roadway and traveled west across both the northbound and southbound lanes. The diesel fuel ran onto the dirt shoulder on the west of the roadway creating a pool that was approximately 2 feet in width and 8 feet in length. Caltrans was notified and responded to the scene to assist coordinating the cleanup.

Road Closure:

US-395 was open during the duration on scene, which were 23 hours and 30 minutes. Two way Traffic control in each direction was conducted initially Sierra Valley Fire Department for the first 1-2 hours. Caltrans later took over the traffic control detail. The involved vehicles were removed and the roadway completely cleaned and was reopened on February 8, 2019, at 2207 hours.

Evacuation:

No evacuation was necessary

Environmental Impact:

An initial assessment determined that, based on the driver's statements regarding the amount of diesel in the tank for the heater, approximately 15 gallons of fuel spilled onto the roadway and eventually traveled to the west shoulder of US-395. The approximate paint spilled was based on 15, 5 gallon paint buckets, which had broken and were spilled on the roadway.

Cleanup Actions:

No air pollution resulted from the spill. Patriot Environmental Services arrived on scene on February 8, 2019, at 0624 hours, to clean up the Hazmat and unload the paint from the trailer of P2.

Actions of Other Agencies:

Caltrans assisted CHP personnel with initial response and scene stabilization. Caltrans Hazmat specialist Suzanne Rohner was on scene.


Ensure all personnel present practice safety at all times. Immediately report any unsafe practices to the safety officer.

Decontamination Plan:

The diesel fuel was contained to a small portion of the west dirt shoulder. Caltrans placed a barrier around the affected area and Sgt. Rolin declared the scene safe at 0201 hours. The dirt will be removed and replaced at a later date. The paint was confined to the roadway which was power washed, sand blasted, and swept.

Demobilization Plan:

The involved commercial vehicle was towed away and the roadway was cleared and reopened on February 8, 2019, at 2207 hours. The scene was declared safe at approximately 0201 hours.
