Grant Application to Sierra Nevada Conservancy to consider possible acquisition of additional easements adjacent to County Road A-21 to allow for the continuation of the Bizz Johnson Trail to the intersection

of County Road A-21 and Highway 36.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Adopt a resolution, approving the application for grant funds for the Sierra Nevada Watershed Improvement Program Strategic Land Conservation Grant Program 2019, to consider possible acquisition of additional easements adjacent to County Road A-21 to allow for the continuation of the Bizz Johnson Trail to the intersection of County Road A-21 and Highway 36.

DISCUSSION

This department submitted a pre-application to the Sierra Nevada Conservancy's Watershed Improvement Program Strategic Land Conservation Grant Program to determine the feasibility of acquiring additional easements parallel to County Road A-21 from adjacent private land managed by W.M Beaty and Associates (Beaty).

Interest in granting additional easements has been expressed by Beaty and their clients. The additional easements would allow for a grade separated, natural surface, corridor along A-21 from Bizz Johnson Trail Head – Mason Station to the intersection of A-21 and Highway 36. Currently the connectivity between the Mason Station Trail Head and Westwood is via A-21 which does not have a bike lane and has limited shoulder width. The grade separated trail would provide a safer route that is similar to the existing natural surface of the Bizz Johnson Trail.

The grant funding if awarded would be used to: 1) Map the existing easement; 2) Define location and dimensions of proposed additional easement; 3) Appraise value of proposed additional easement for potential future acquisition.

The <u>Lassen County General Plan - 2000</u> states the following:

The Recreation Resources Element of the General Plan States:

GOAL N-18: An expanded range of outdoor recreation resources, facilities and opportunities.

NR65 POLICY: The County encourages the development of public recreation facilities subject to the determination of appropriateness and adequacy of specific sites and the mitigation of major land use conflicts and/or significant environmental impacts.

The Open Space Element of the General Plan States:

GOAL O-4: To encourage the establishment and maintenance of open space areas for outdoor recreation, including recreational trails, and, when appropriate, the development of related recreational facilities.

OS11 POLICY: The County supports the development of trails and bicycle routes and the integration of those trails and routes into regional and state systems provided that such uses are planned and developed with the cooperation and agreement of adjacent land owners and affected agencies, utilize public right-of-ways and negotiated easements, satisfactorily mitigate potential trespass and liability issues to the satisfaction of affected private property owners, resolve potential resource management conflicts with affected agricultural and timber production land uses, and must have resolved the legal question as to who has the reversionary interest in the property.

OS13: The County supports utilization trails within public right-ofways where those right-of-ways can serve as part of interconnected trail systems (e.g., public highway corridors and abandoned railroad grades.)

Implementation Measures:

OS-F The County will work with other agencies, interest groups, and affected property owners in the consideration of trail master plans, trail routes and trail oriented recreational uses

and in consideration of the feasibility of integrating trail routs in Lassen County with other routes in the region.

OS15 POLICY: The County does not favor the acquisition or taking of private property for public access across private lands for public recreation purposes unless development of the access is approved by and acceptable to the property owner.

Lassen County Bikeway Master Plan 1999 states the following:

Proposed System Development:

Off Street Bikeways – Where feasible, Class I bike paths on grade separated rights-of-way should be implemented. These bikeways provide a higher degrees of safety and recreational benefit that bikeways located on streets. They can also become linear parks, adding to the range of amenities for local communities. In many areas of Lassen County, the cost of constructing off-street bikeways may be competitive with that for on street facilities due to physical characteristics of the existing roadway system.

Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy 2012 states the following:

4.2 Goal Setting

Visitor-Serving Market - GOAL: Magnet to Draw Visitors

- Aspirational Goal: One of the Top 15 Mountain Biking Destination in the US.
- Draw visitors and strengthen tourism and recreational activities.
- Comprehensive trail system.
- Bicycling facilities, trails, promotions.
- Effective management and preservation of natural resources to enable continued use by residents and visitors.

Attracting Visitors Priority 1 Action – Package and Promote

Bike Trails – Bike trails and the outdoors are Lassen
County's strongest asset and best icons for attracting
visitors. To reach the aspirational goal of one of the Top 15
Mountain Biking trails in the US, continuous development
must occur to improve, extend, and enhance the experience
for avid mountain bikers to earn such a reputation.

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the Sierra Nevada Conservancy require a resolution certifying the approval of application(s) by the Applicant's governing board before submission of said application(s) to the SNC; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant, if selected, will enter into an agreement with the SNC to carry out the project; and

WHEREAS, the County has identified the Bizz Johnson Extension Project as valuable toward meeting its mission and goals.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Lassen, State of California, that this Board:

Approves the submittal of an application for the Bizz Johnson Extension Project; and

Certifies that Applicant understands the assurances and certification requirements in the application; and

Certifies that Applicant or title holder will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the resource(s) consistent with the long-term benefits described in support of the application; or will secure the resources to do so; and

Certifies that Applicant will comply with all legal requirements as determined during the application process; and

Appoints the Director of Public Works/Transportation, or designee, as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to: applications, agreements, payment requests, and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project(s).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Lassen does hereby authorize Director of Public Works/Transportation to sign any documents required to apply for and accept these subject funds on behalf of the County of Lassen.
