SUBJECT: ECORP Consulting, Inc. Agreement– Environmental Engineering Services

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Supervisors 1) Approve Agreement with ECORP Consulting, Inc. 2) Authorize the County Administrative Office to sign.

DISCUSSION: The Road Department has the need to complete environmental monitoring and studies for various projects located throughout the County. The work to be completed under this Agreement is for the required environmental services in providing revegetation assistance/annual revegetation monitoring for the Skyline Road Extension construction project per the permit requirements, conducting hydrologic and vegetation monitoring of the Robinson Canyon Mitigation Site, and the preparation of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and permit registration documents for the Long Valley Creek Bridges 7C-12 and 7C-81 replacement projects on Hackstaff Road. The monitoring activities for the Skyline Road Extension Project and the Robinson Canyon Mitigation Site include annually monitoring and reporting for a five year period.

ECORP Consulting, Inc. has successfully completed several environmental studies for the County, including working on each of these projects and have a good working relationship with Caltrans and the different permitting agencies.

Individual cost estimate/scope of work proposals have been received for each of these three projects with a total not-to-exceed amount of \$83,150 (Skyline Road Extension \$45,700, Robinson Canyon \$31,700, and Hackstaff Bridges \$5,750).

ALTERNATIVE: Not Approve.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$83,150 is available within the annual Road Operating Budget (122-1221) for completing this work. Federal reimbursement is available for portions of this work.
