Subject: Budget Adoption for Byrne JAG Grant and creation of 1.5 FTE Community Services Officer positions.

Discussion:

In 2015, the Lassen County Sheriff's Office applied for and obtained funding for a youth crime prevention and education program. The funding was made available by the federal government through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, and administered by the California Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC). The Sheriff's Office, in partnership with other agencies, operated a successful school-based life skills program as well as a youth diversion program. The Program funding ended in 2017 due to a dispute between state and federal governments. The BSCC issued an RFP in the spring of 2019, and the Lassen County Sheriff's Office submitted a grant proposal on behalf of Lassen County. In April of 2019, the Lassen County Board of Supervisors authorized County Administrative Officer Richard Egan to sign the application, as well as the grant agreement and any amendments. On September 12, 2019, the BSCC approved the proposal submitted by the Sheriff's Office. Our proposal scored the highest of all proposals submitted in the "small county" category. The award granted by the BSCC to Lassen County is for \$220,000 each year, for three years. The grant agreements will be received in the near future, and the grant period started on October 1, 2019.

To move the project forward, the Sheriff's Office is requesting that the Board of Supervisors approve the attached budget for the 2019/2020 fiscal year with a total appropriation of \$220,000, and an equal amount of revenue. 1.5 FTE Community Services Officer Positions will also have to be created and recruited.

This program will add to the programs the Sheriff's Office is currently providing in Lassen County Schools through tobacco grants, and will help support our goals of early intervention and prevention.

Fiscal Impact:

There will be no general fund impact.

Recommendation:

That the Board of Supervisors approve fund and budget unit 182-0544 with a total appropriation of \$220,000 and a revenue of \$220,000 for the 2019/2020 fiscal year. Additionally, it is recommended that the Board of Supervisors authorize the addition of 1.5 FTE Community Services Officer Positions

Congratulations! The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is happy to announce Lassen County was selected as an Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) award recipient at the September 12, 2019 Board meeting. Twenty-seven agencies will be offered \$16.2 million for a contracted period of October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2021. All chosen agencies will be establishing or maintaining programs within the JAG Program Purpose Areas of:

- 1.) Prevention and Education Programs
- 2.) Law Enforcement Programs
- 3.) Prosecution, Courts, Defense, and Indigent Defense

Within the next 60-days, BSCC staff will contact the project Director and/or Financial Officer for additional administrative, program, and financial information. These activities include:

- Confirming the contact information of grant-funded staff;
- Emailing a JAG Grant Agreement;
- Requesting a Governing Board Resolution;
- Requesting a detailed JAG Grant Budget;
- Discussing program outcomes and metrics; and
- Identifying Grantee Orientation Participants.

Grant Agreement Documents

BSCC staff will email an electronic copy of the JAG Grant Agreement by October 30, 2019. Review the Grant Agreement and then complete the following:

- Carefully review the Grant Agreement and retain a copy for your records. Upon execution, this becomes your contractually obligated Scope of Work.
- Print two (2) copies of the Grant Agreement. <u>Both copies</u> must be signed and dated in <u>blue ink</u> by the Authorized Officer;
- Print, complete, and sign one (1) copy of Appendix B; and
- Mail both signed hard copies of the Grant Agreement and the signed copy of Appendix B to:

Please note your agency may start your local JAG project on October 1, 2019 but, the JAG Grant Agreement is not effective until the BSCC receives a signed Governing Board Resolution and the county has signed the JAG Grant Agreement. The BSCC will not execute the grant agreement or process reimbursement claims until all prior mentioned activities are complete.

Grantee Orientation

The BSCC will host a Grantee Orientation on November 5, 2019 in West Sacramento. The purpose of the Grantee Orientation is to review grant requirements; administrative responsibilities; invoicing processes and procedures; data collection, reporting and evaluation obligations; and other grant management activities.

Each Grantee may bring a team of <u>up to four individuals</u>. At a minimum, attendance is required for the individuals identified as the Project Director and Financial Officer. If known, a community-based service provider and project evaluator are encouraged to attend. Additional details on the Grantee Orientation will be provided in the coming weeks.

Operational Agreement Between the Lassen County Sheriff's Office and Susanville Police Department

This Operational Agreement stands as evidence that the *Lassen County Sheriff's Office* and the *Susanville Police Department* intend to work together toward the goals outlined in the Three-Year JAG Strategy. Both agencies believe that implementation of the *Lassen County Prevention & Education Program* as described within this proposal, will further these goals. Each agency agrees to participate in the JAG Program, if selected for funding, as outlined herein.

The **Lassen County Sheriff's Office** project will closely coordinate JAG services and activities with the **Susanville Police Department** through:

- Project staff including, but not limited to the Susanville Police Department's Youth Services Officer, being readily available to assist all grant partners, on a full time basis in the implementation of Life Skills Training, Safe Date, and Green Dot curriculum in High Schools and Middle Schools throughout Lassen County as well as Lassen College; and
- Attend regularly scheduled meetings occurring at least monthly between Lassen County Sheriff's Office Youth Services Officer, Behavioral Health's Prevention Specialists, Susanville Indian Rancheria's Indian Education Coordinator, Community Church's Youth Leader, to discuss strategies, timetables, and implementation of mandated services.

Specifically:

- Implementation of Safe Date and Life Skills Training Curriculum through the school-based program in middle schools and high schools throughout Lassen County.
- Implementation of the Green Dot Program through community engagement and outreach.
- Reinstatement of the Life Skills Program through the Diversionary Program for delinquent youth;
- The Lassen County Sheriff, Susanville Chief of Police, Lassen County Chief of Probation, and Lassen County Health and Human Services' Director, Susanville Indian Rancheria Education Coordinator, and Community Church Youth Leader will meet at least quarterly to discuss the progress of the program, budget and administrative policies.
- This Agreement will be effective from October, 2019 to December 31, 2022.
- Funding for the salary and associated benefits of a full-time 1.0 FTE Susanville Police Department Youth Services Officer from JAG state funds will be designated to the City of Susanville for their services (contingent on annual funding through JAG program).
- Amount of JAG state funds designated to the Susanville Police Department are estimated at \$47,199 year 1, \$48,615 year 2 and \$50,073 year 3.
