13. Requirement for Data on Performance and Effectiveness Under the Award

The base salary for this position is \$5034 for the entire 12-month grant period of October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022. Therefore, the total salary for the Coordinator will be \$60,408.00. The Coordinator receives a longevity increase of 10% over the course of the entire grant period for a total of an additional \$6,040.80. The Victim/ Witness Program Coordinator total salary equals \$66,448.80, which is rounded up to \$66,449.00. The Coordinator receives the following benefits from Lassen County:

Coordinator position will be \$90,178.00 and will be paid 75% utilizing VOCA 19 funds and 25% utilizing VOCA 20 funds. Due to the Coordinator supervising the MVA, 5% of the salary and benefits will be allocated to the MVA funds (VOCA 20) for a total of \$4,510.00.

The Victim/ Witness Coordinator/ Advocate will be responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Victim/ Witness grant project, supervise the Victim/ Witness Advocate and the Mass Victimization Advocate; as well as any Volunteers within the program. They will carry an advocacy caseload, which will provide direct advocacy services to the victims of crime who request services from our program. Administrative duties shall include, but are not limited to, the responsibility for project reporting; overseeing the grant project, including compliance issues; overseeing the delivery of services; coordination of community outreach projects; overseeing training of staff and the training of outside agencies; provide direct services to victims of crime pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 - 13835.5 and Penal Code 679-680 and other administrative duties as they arise. The Coordinator also attends as many of the trainings regarding mass victimization and spends a portion of their time specifically with the MVA to work on protocols and plans.

The MVA is compensated at the Lassen County UPEC Range 15, Step A for 3 months at a base salary of \$3,111 and will move to a Range 15, Step B for the remaining 9 months at a base salary of \$3,255. The total salary for the MVA will be \$38,628.00. The MVA receives the following benefits from Lassen County:

The Mass Victimization Advocate will develop a crisis response/ mass victimization plan for Lassen County; create LCVW protocols when responding to a mass victimization incident; create MOU's with community agencies, law enforcement, local school districts and neighboring counties; attend and conduct outreach events regarding crisis response/ mass victimization. The MVA will be working on crisis response job duties 10% or 4 hours a week and 90% or 36 hours a week providing direct services to victims of crime pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 - 13835.5 and Penal Code 679-680; and will carry the bulk of the caseload for the program.

District Attorney Program Manager/ Routine Fiscal Position: The fiscal position will be at .075 FTE (or 7.5%/ 3 hours a week) within our program. The fiscal position is compensated at the Lassen County Mid-management Range 22. Step F for 9 months at a base salary of \$5,262 and will move to Mid-Management Range 22, Step G for 3 months at a base salary of \$5,624 for the 12-month grant period of October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022. The base salary at Range 22 F for this position is \$5,262 a month multiplied by 9 months at 7.5% is a total salary of \$3,551.85. The base salary at Range 22 G for this position is \$5,624 a month multiplied by 3 months at 7.5% is a total salary of \$1,265.40. PERS Unfunded Retirement Liability: The total PERS Unfunded Retirement Liability expenses that are attributable to the project as stated by the County of Lassen is \$20,393.00. The retirement liability costs will be paid 75% utilizing VOCA 19 funds and utilizing 25% VOCA 20 funds. Due to 15% of staff is funded out of the MVA funds (VOCA 20) for a total of \$3059.00.

We are dedicating only a small percentage (19%) or our total grant funds to operating expenses, only those minimum amounts necessary to support the program and provide services to victims. We are committed to dedicating the largest percentage of our total grant funds to PERSONNEL COSTS, in furtherance of the grant's objectives.

Our operating costs will be:

Communications (Office Phones): We are allocating \$720.00 for the programs use of the county phone system. This amount will cover the cost of the public phone number used by all Victim/Witness Staff and Volunteers as well as a private phone number for the Coordinator and the MVA/VWA. Therefore, the total of \$720.00 is being charged to the grant for this purpose. The costs of communications will be covered by utilizing 26% VOCA 19 funds and utilizing 74% VOCA 20 funds.

Liability Insurance: The liability insurance costs attributed to this program by the County of Lassen will be \$1501.00. The costs of this insurance will be covered by utilizing 100% VWA0 21 funds.

Memberships: We are allocating \$132.00 for membership fees for California

District Attorneys Association for the Coordinator (\$88) and the MVA/VWA (\$44).

Therefore, the total of \$132.00. The costs of memberships will be covered by unitizing 100% VOCA 19 funds.

Office Supplies: We are allocating \$2,590.00 for office supplies (copy/ printer paper, printer toner, pens, file folders, labels, business cards...etc.) to be used for Victim/ Witness. The total of \$2,590.00 is being charged to the grant for this purpose. The costs of office supplies will be covered by utilizing 31% VOCA 19 funds, utilizing 30% VOCA 20 funds and utilizing 39% VWAO 21 funds.

Cell Phone Service: We are allocating \$1,080.00 for extending the cellular service and data plan through the end of the grant project. Victim/ Witness has Straight talk cell phones for the staff (Coordinator and MVA/VWA) to utilize to contact clients, law enforcement or the main office when out of the office. The cellular/ data plan cost \$45.00 a month per phone. The costs of the cell service will be covered by utilizing 92% VOCA 19 funds and utilizing 8% VOCA 20 funds.

Copier Expense: We are allocating \$1,065.00 for the purpose of covering the cost of the copier lease and maintenance for the Lassen County District

Attorney's Office, which LCVW is, one of four divisions that utilize the copier on a daily basis. The cost of the copier for a year is \$4,259.20, if you divide it by the 4 divisions it would be a cost of \$1,065 billable to LCVW. The costs of the copier

expenses will be covered by utilizing 47% VOCA 19 funds and utilizing 53% VWA0 21 funds.

Martin Security System: We are allocating \$120.00 for the purpose of covering the cost of the Martin Security System at 2950 Riverside Drive, Susanville, CA for the Lassen County District Attorney's Office, which includes LCVW. The annual cost of the security system is \$480.00, if you divide it by the 4 divisions it would be a cost of \$120.00 billable to LCVW. The costs of the security system will be covered by utilizing 100% VOCA 19 funds.

Karpel Data Base System: We are allocating \$1,141.00 for the purpose of covering the cost Karpel (database that the Lassen County District Attorney's Office and LCVW uses to keep track of defendants and victims that were referred by law enforcement for criminal charges.) Karpel charges an annual fee of \$550.00 per user to have access to log in information, including victim statistics. LCVW will have 2.075 users, 1 Coordinator, 1 MVA/VWA in Karpel as well as the 7.5% of LCDA Program Coordinator. \$550 times two equals \$1,100.00 and 7.5% of \$550 is \$41 for a total of \$1,141.00. The cost of \$1,141.00 is billable to LCVW. The costs of Karpel will be covered by utilizing 18% VOCA 19 funds and utilizing 82% VWAO 21 funds.

Outreach Promotional and Victim's Rights Week Service Award: We are allocating \$800.00 for the purchase of outreach promotional items (like reusable grocery/ tote bags, pens, chap stick or hand sanitizer) and to purchase items for our annual Victim Services Award that we present to someone in the community during NCVRW for their dedication to assisting victims in our community (a personalized plague and an appreciation gift). The cost of \$800.00 for the promotional items and appreciation award will be covered by utilizing 100% VWAO 21 funds.

Postage: We are allocating \$598.00 for postage. Victim/Witness sends out numerous correspondences through metered mail because of being in such a rural county. Therefore, the total amount for postage will be \$598.00. The costs of postage will be covered by utilizing 100% VWAO 21 funds.

Informational Technology (IT) Direct Billing: The IT direct billing is to cover the cost of internet services, email access through Outlook, Office 365 (Word, Excel...), anti-virus and system storage/ back up that will be set-up and maintained through our county IT department. Each county staff workstation (desktops, laptops or tablets) is charged the same amount for all of the services, which is \$2,000, no matter their FTE status. Victim/Witness will have two desktops

attributable to the project and two mobile devices (2 tablets) attributable to the project, and 7.5% of the cost of the LCDA Program Coordinator, so the cost of the IT direct billing is \$8,150.00. The costs of the IT direct billing will be covered by utilizing 60% VOCA 19 funds, utilizing 15% VOCA 20 funds (which would be all and the amount of \$1,223.00), utilizing 25% VWAO 21 funds.

Facility Rental for 2950 Riverside Drive (Victim/Witness office location): The program has three offices for the Victim/Witness staff and volunteers to utilize, as well as a Victim/Witness Lobby that can be closed off to the rest of the District Afterney's Office. There is also storage space for Victim/Witness supplies and closed client files, a copy room, as well as access to three meeting rooms and training room (when available). The space allocated to Victim/Witness for the two offices and lobby has been calculated by Lassen County as 253 square feet and for our portion of the storage room, copy room and meeting rooms come to 294 square feet. The total square footage for the program is 547 square feet at the county rate of \$11.26 per foot, per year for a total of \$6,159.22, which is rounded to \$6,159.00. The county is not charging the \$2.00 per square foot per menth for a max of \$24.00 a square foot per year. Therefore, our rent is lower than the grant will cover. The costs of rental space will be covered by utilizing 100% VWAO 21 funds.

Indirect Costs (A-87): The Indirect Costs attributed to this program by the County of Lassen will be \$4,367.00. The Indirect Cost Rate will be 10% de Minimis of the project. The total grant of \$215,996 minus match of \$0 minus rent/space allocation of \$6,159, minus the \$4,367 indirect cost equals \$205,470. When you take \$205,470 and multiply that by 10%, you get \$20,547.00 for the allowable indirect costs for the project year. Iransportation: We are allocating \$1,350.00 for the purpose of purchasing fuel for the VW vehicle. Lassen County is rural and some areas are more than 70 miles each way from our office in Susanville. We are anticipating utilizing 300 gallons of fuel at \$4 a gallon for a total of \$1,200. In addition, we anticipate having bi-quarter oil changes with tire rotations at \$75 each for \$150.00. The total for the cost of transportation is \$1,350.00. The costs of the fuel will be covered by utilizing 100% VOCA 20 funds.



 - Our program provides services pursuant to California Penal Code 13835.4 13835.5. We assist victims of crime by educating people on the criminal justice system, victim's rights (Marsy's Law), provide local/state/national resources and referrals for services, assist victims with obtaining their property that was held as evidence, attend court/law enforcement interviews and attorney interviews with victims, provide victims with timely information about their case and possible resolutions and assist victims with making a request for restitution.
- 10. Describe practical and/or logistical obstacles to providing match: Lassen County is a large county, however, it is very rural. About half of the county population resides in the county seat, Susanville; the other half reside in one of the unincorporated towns that span 5 to 77+ miles from Susanville. Our county does not have what many would call a "large city" and we only have a community college; these are obstacles when trying to find qualified interns and volunteers to assist our program in the ways of in-kind match.
- 11. Describe any local resource constraints to providing match:

 Our program is housed within the Lassen County District Attorney's Department; being able to accept donations for cash match becomes difficult. At this uncertain time due to Covid-19; a lot of our businesses and service providers are struggling to stay afloat and unable to provide donations or many services. We have utilized volunteers in the past to meet our in-kind match, however due to Covid-19 we are not allowing outside persons to assist our program; and we utilized volunteers for community events which are mostly postponed until the state "re-opens".
