CAO Egan gave an overview of the continuance of the Proclamation of Local Emergency and action for the Board to take. Office of Emergency Services (OES) Chief Silas Rojas informed the Board the Lassen County Health Officer, Dr. Korver was reviewing a policy to re-open Lassen County, however there would not be a guarantee Dr. Korver would sign the policy. OES Chief Rojas stated he understood the economic impact COVID-19 is having on the county but the decision to re-open needed to be intelligent and calculated. OES Chief Rojas also stated they were working on phases of re-opening the county and advised retailers to open in a manner that's economically feasible but also with levels of safety to protect patrons, employees and owners. OES Chief Rojas reminded the Board that Lassen County is still bound by the state order. Sheriff/Coroner Dean Growdon briefly discussed businesses in Lassen County and social distancing. OES Chief Rojas reminded the Board that certain business in Lassen County are corporate decisions to close and they are working on contacting these corporations to encourage them to re-open. Additional discussion was held.

CAO Egan stated the Board had requested this item to be agendaized to discuss new or augmented revenue sources. CAO Egan stated Lassen County is faced with financial difficulty and there have been long standing issues that needed to be addressed. Supervisor Teeter stated he requested this item to discuss the

threat of unfunded employment liability, revenues and expenses. Discussion was held regarding new revenue, reduction in employees, reduction in services provided and the 2019/2020 Fiscal Year Budget. Treasurer/Tax Collector Nancy Cardenas spoke on her view of cash flow, general fund and unfunded employment liability. Deputy CAO Tony shaw also discussed Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT). Additional discussion was held.
